Malcolm has been working in the long-term savings, investment and protection markets for nearly 50 years and has spoken at TPNW on several occasions. Originally from the US, Belden started his consulting career with McKinsey & Co where he worked across a range of service and manufacturing industries. Subsequently, he was recruited by CSC Index to help create and deliver a breakthrough methodology using emerging technology to change organisational culture. After a variety of corporate development venturing and roles, Belden returned to management consulting in 2002. One of the topics that has caught his attention recently is the issue of organisational purpose - and how that fits with investor expectations.
